VISION

Turn Up Knox will serve as a community-informed intervention program that reduces gun violence in the Knoxville area. We envision a community where ALL residents are safe from gun violence.

MISSION


Turn Up Knox strives to interrupt cycles of gun violence in the Knoxville area. We support, equip, empower people to create a safer and healthier community.

THE PROBLEM

The City of Knoxville is a mid-sized city in East Tennessee, known for its location near the Great Smoky Mountains. It is the third-largest city in Tennessee and the largest in the eastern division. Knox County, where Knoxville is located, has a population of around 478,971, with approximately 190,740 residents in the city. Unfortunately, like many other cities in the United States, Knoxville saw a significant increase in violent crime during 2020 and 2021.

Between 2010 and 2014, Knoxville averaged 17.2 homicides per year; between 2015 and 2019, the city averaged 23.2 homicides per year. In 2020 and 2021, the city experienced 37 and 41 homicides, respectively. In 2020, while the nation experienced 7.8 homicides per 100,000 people, Knoxville experienced 19.7 per 100,000 people. In 2021, that number rose to 21.4 per 100,000 residents. In 2021, 93% of homicides in Knoxville involved a firearm. In 2022, 35 lives were lost to violence.

THE PROBLEM

In an average year, more than 35,000 15- to 24-year-olds are shot and killed or wounded in the US—58% of these deaths are by gun homicide, and 46% of these injuries are by gun assault.4 Violence in cities is often cyclical, and the trauma that comes with it can lead youth to engage in violence. The same youth who are victimized by violence are often also perpetrators. In cities during 2019, youth under 25 made up 42% of arrests for murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, 52% of arrests for robbery, 27% of arrests for aggravated assault, and 39% of arrests for weapons offenses.

One concerning aspect is that homicides in Knoxville disproportionately affect the Black population. Although Black residents make up about 17% of the city's population, they account for about 75% of individuals involved in shooting incidents between 2019 and 2021. The violence is concentrated in areas with high concentrations of Black or poor residents. Black Knoxvillians not only bear a larger share of the burden of community-based violence but also face higher poverty rates than other racial demographics.

In Knox County, Black residents represent approximately 9% of the population, yet nearly 30% live below the poverty line, while 12.2% of white residents do. The poverty rate among Black residents in the City of Knoxville is approximately 34%, the highest among any racial demographic in the county. These disparities highlight the challenges faced by Black residents in terms of violence and poverty in Knoxville.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

Turn Up Knox focused heavily on community programming and event sponsorship to build awareness around the organization throughout the project year. This was a critical component for the organization early on. Turn Up Knox relies on referrals from the community and in order for its Violence Interrupters to be effective, community members need to know that the organization exists and can be a helpful resource for interrupting violence throughout the city of Knoxville.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING (CONT'D)

Partnership with local community organizations remains a critical component of building awareness around the organization, improving trust with the community, and enhancing community partnership. Turn Up Knox has continued to partner with several local community-based organizations, including Emerald Youth Foundation, Drums Up Guns Down, Shadetree Therapy, Love is the Answer, YWCA, and Boys & Girls Club, for a number of community events. To date, there have been a total of 121 community contacts made, including local business owners and other local organizations. We have established continuing partnerships with Drums Up Guns Down, YWCA, Emerald Youth Foundation, and Safe Haven. These relationships have been important for our violence interruption work. It has been a priority for Turn Up Knox to build trust not only amongst the community members but also among other organizations that have been around for some time. This has allowed Turn Up Knox to create even more awareness around the work of the organization.
